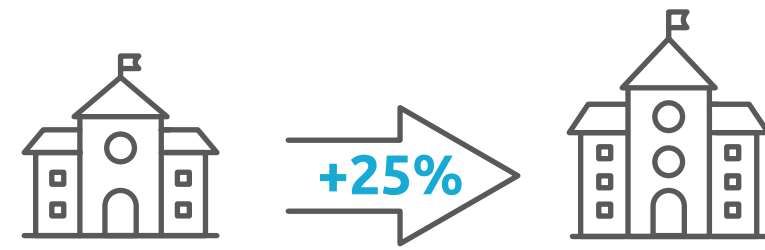


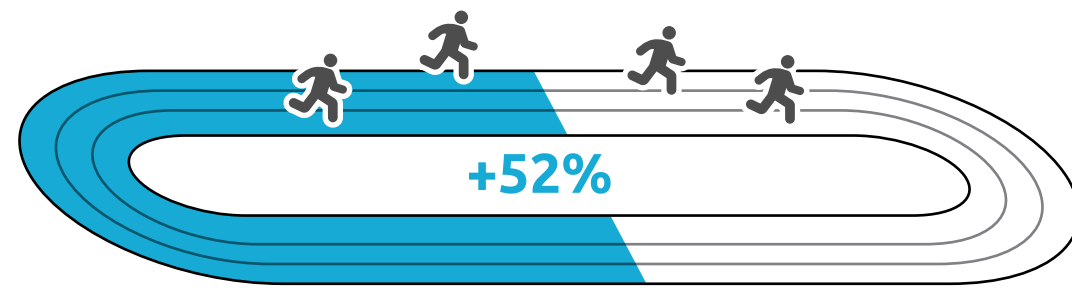
SNAPSHOT: GLOBAL CAMPAIGN FOR INCLUSION

SPECIAL OLYMPICS EUROPE EURASIA

Collaborated with government ministries to organize Unified Sports, hosted inclusive summer camps, and presented Unified activities in public spaces.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS EAST ASIA

Introduced a Unified physical education course in schools, held large-scale Unified events, and hosted a Youth Leadership Summit.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS ASIA PACIFIC

Trained university students on Special Olympics activities, formed official agreements with city governments, and established community spaces as permanent venues for Unified competitions.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS MIDDLE EAST/NORTH AFRICA

Youth Leaders led efforts in recruiting new Unified Schools, fundraising, and spreading awareness about Special Olympics.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS AFRICA

Partnered with local nonprofit organizations, held large-scale Unified Sports events, and expanded its Unified Schools network to a refugee camp and rural locales.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS CARIBBEAN

Recruited several new schools to its Unified Schools network and demonstrated success in its Unified football program.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS LATIN AMERICA

Involved people of all abilities in large scale Unified celebrations and increased its focus on fundraising and fostering local partnerships.

A Special Olympics International delegation met in Cairo with His Excellency Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, President of Egypt, to formalize Egypt's commitment to the Coalition and also received training on engaging other national governments.



An advisory board was created to help generate increased access to national governments and strengthen the ability of the Coalition to maximize its impact.



Special Olympics opened discussions with Harvard University about the possibility of its serving as both a research and training partner for the Coalition.
